

YVONNE CRANE



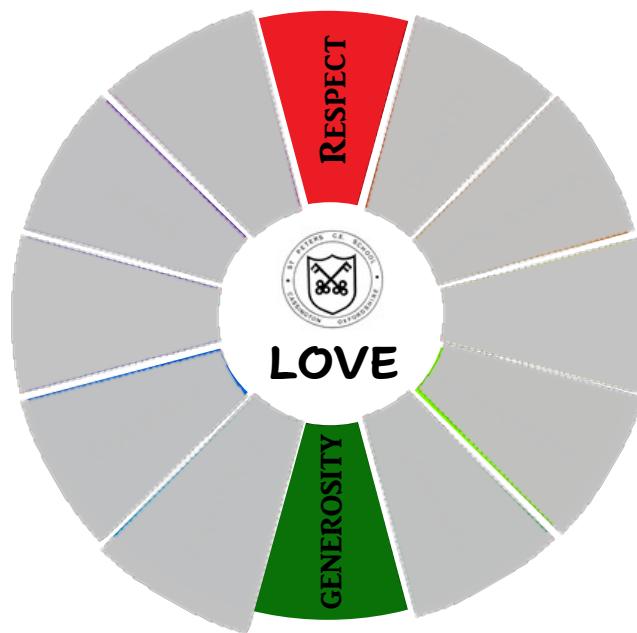
