PE Intent

St Peter's aims to inspire all children to develop a love of physical activity and sport. Through great physical education and our school values we aim to nurture confident, resilient children who will strive for their personal best. The intent of our PE curriculum is to provide all children with high quality PE and sport provision. We strive to inspire our pupils through fun and engaging PE lessons that are enjoyable, challenging and accessible to all. We want our pupils to be inspired by the benefits of a healthy and physically active lifestyle.

PE Implementation

Teaching and Learning

At St Peter's, PE is timetabled for 2 lessons per week. In EYFS and KS1, 1 of their lessons is forest school, the other is taught through the scheme Get Set 4 PE. KS2 are also taught using this scheme, but also through independent teacher planning following the progression of skills document using the National Curriculum. The lessons in this scheme are progressive, coherent and apply fundamental movement and game skills which are year group appropriate, alongside relevant progression. Teachers carefully consider where each unit of PE work will fit across their long-term plans. They may, for example, choose a dance unit that fits in with their topic or they may choose similar sports (e.g. invasion games) across two consecutive terms to see how the skills they have taught prior can progress.

All Key Stage 2 children have swimming lessons for one term of the year.

There are extensive opportunities for children to take part in sporting events throughout the year at MAT level. Children are invited to attend competitive sporting events and festivals within the local area. This is an inclusive approach which endeavours to encourage not only physical development but also mental well-being. These events also develop teamwork and leadership skills and are very much enjoyed by the children.

The year 5 and 6 children are trained by our School Sport's Co-ordinator to become Young Leaders. They will be involved in assisting with lunch-time clubs, our annual Sports day and other sporting activities within school.

Planning

We use the National Curriculum and the Get Set 4 PE scheme of work alongside a PE progression map which ensures children are exposed to a breadth of skills within PE (dance, gymnastics, games, swimming and outdoor activities).

Get Set 4 PE baseline assessments are carried out at the beginning of a term and an at the end of a term. The assessments from Get Set 4 PE are used to collate information which ensure consistency and progression of skills within a key stage and across KS1 and 2.

What is the impact of our teaching?

We help motivate children to participate in a variety of sports through quality teaching that is engaging and fun. From our lessons, our children learn to take responsibility for their own health and fitness. We equip our children with the necessary skills and a love for sport. They will hopefully grow up to live happy and healthy lives utilising the skills and knowledge acquired through PE.

Our PE curriculum is progressive and allows children to develop fundamental skills and apply them to a variety of sports and activities. We measure the impact on learning by using Get Set 4 PE assessments.
