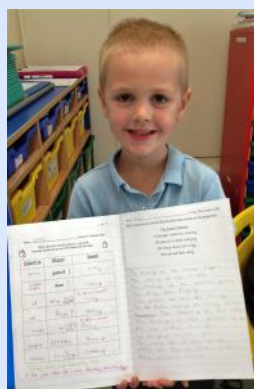

We are currently finalising the behaviour policy which will be rolled out at the start of next term. This will be available on the website and sent directly to you through ParentMail on the 29th October (INSET day). The new policy is centred around positive praise, good manners and de-escalating situations by helping children learn to find a better way. By treating everyone with respect, and understanding how their actions can affect others, both positively and negatively, the children can be confident in how behaviour is being dealt with.
