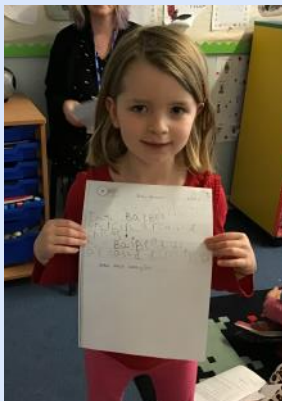
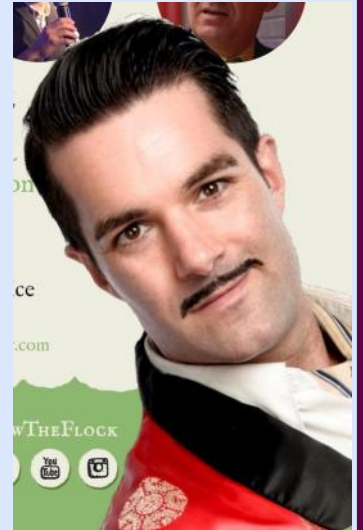


Comedy night
