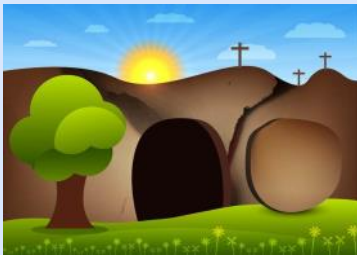

What beautiful weather to end the week on – hopefully a taste of things to come for the Easter holidays!

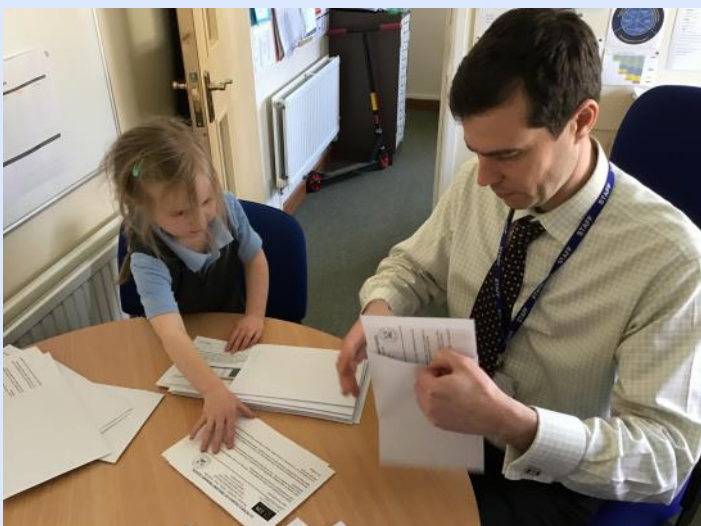
