CHANGE for KS1 & 2 Sports Day!! IMPORTANT!

Sports Days this year are on Monday 11th AND Monday 18th July for Oak, Maple & Willow and Tuesday 12th July for Apple Tree.

On Monday at 9:15, the children will be taking part in running races at the Elms Road playing field. Because the weather is set to be very hot in the afternoon on Monday, and the school field now doesn't have as much shade, we are postponing the afternoon activities until the following Monday morning at 9:15am. The children



will be taking part in different activities on the school field. Parents are welcome to attend both of them if they would like to.

On Tuesday 12th, the children in Apple Tree Class will be taking part in activities on the school field, followed by a picnic. Again, parents are welcome to attend.

Dear Parents / Carers,

To bring St Peter's in line with other EPA schools and to fulfil statutory requirements from Sept '23 (32.5 hours a week), we will be slightly altering the start and finish times of the school day.

Currently gates open at 8:35 and register and gate closes at 8:55. Pick up time is 3pm.

From September '22, gates will open from 8.30 and register and gate closes at 8:40. Pick up time will be 3.10pm.

Nursery sessions will be 8:30 - 11:45 and 12pm-3pm

Breakfast club will be from 8:00-8:30 and After School Club sessions will be 3:10-4:15pm and 4:15pm-5:15pm

Judo will be from 7:45 until 8:30 (please don't arrive any earlier than 7:45) and football and other 'external' clubs will be 3:10-4:10

We have selected these times to minimise any potential impact on your school day routines.

Mrs Houghton and Mrs Bradley will be holding a meeting on Tuesday 12th July at 3:15pm in the school hall for the children who will be in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 in September.

There will be some important information about phonics & reading, and it's also a chance to meet your child's teacher!

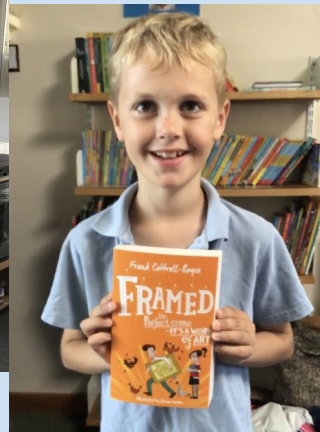


Our Book Review winners for this fortnight!

A Message From Mr Jeffries



Dear Parents/Carers,

As the academic year draws to a close, there is much to reflect on. Last week we had our St Peter's Day celebrations with drama, music and art & craft activities. It was wonderful to see so many parents who were able to join us and take part in these activities. After all the ups and downs of the last few years, it was really lovely for us to come together as a community and celebrate all that has been achieved.

KS2 SATs results were published this week. Our year 6 children did incredibly well, and every child has their own success story. As a school, 67% of children achieved the Age-Related Expectation in reading, writing and maths and this compares to 59% nationally.

This completes a very healthy set of results for all of our year groups completing standardised tests this year. Our KS1 children did very well with the year 2 tests and the year 1 phonics, as did the reception children who will start year 1 next year in a very strong position.

This was also the first year for the year 4 multiplication checks and again the children excelled themselves. A huge congratulations to all the children, a big well done to all the staff for your hard work and commitment and a huge thank you to all the families who have supported your children and the school through this process.

We are now getting 4 or 5 delicious eggs a day from our lovely rescue chickens.

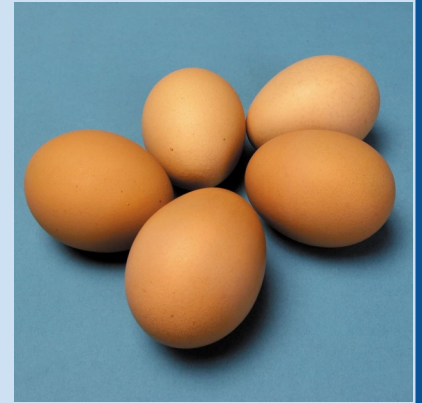

ACCEPTING

Think carefully before you click on or open something online (e.g. links, adverts, friend requests, photos) as you never know where they may lead to or they may contain viruses. Do not accept something if you are unsure of who the person is or what they've sent you.

RELIABLE

You cannot trust everything you see online as some things can be out of date, inaccurate or not entirely true. To find reliable information compare at least three different websites, check in books and talk to someone about what you have found.



T

TELL

Tell a trusted adult if something or someone ever makes you feel upset, worried or confused. This could be if you or someone you know is being bullied online. There are lots of people who will be able to help you like your teachers, parents, carers or contact Childline – 0800 11 11 or www.childline.org.uk
